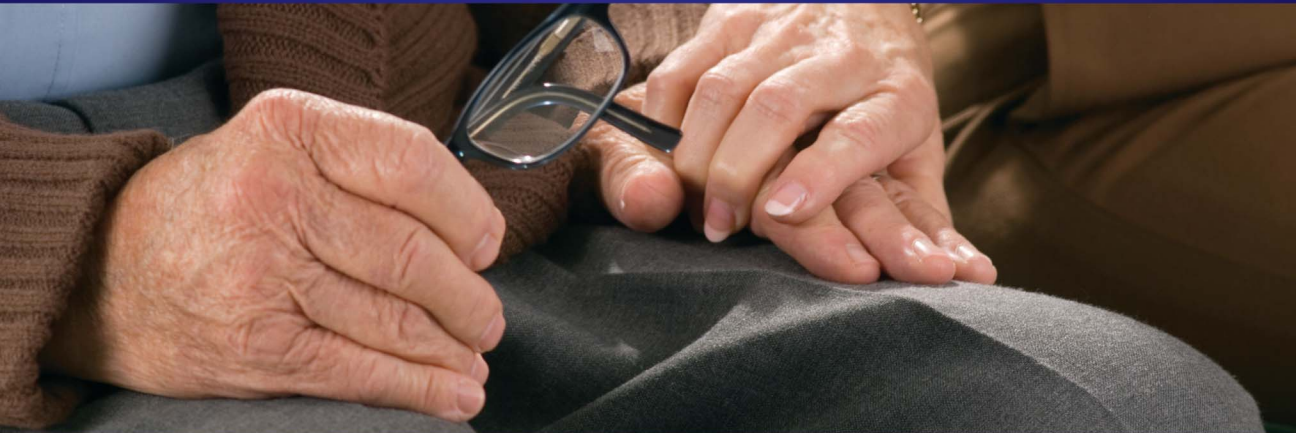


A message for people with **PARKINSON'S DISEASE**



Many people are unaware that over time those with Parkinson's disease develop unusual behaviors like: **Seeing, feeling or hearing things that are not really there.** Sometimes, friends and family are suspected of things, such as stealing or cheating on them.

Now, a clinical research study of an investigational medication is available for people who demonstrate these symptoms of Parkinson's disease.

Because there are no FDA-approved treatments for these particular symptoms of Parkinson's disease, medical research is a way to test and advance future medicines for this condition.

To be accepted into this study, you must:

- Be at least 40 years or older
- Have been diagnosed with Parkinson's disease for at least 1 year
- Show unusual behaviors as described on the left.

Those eligible to participate receive:

- Health checks at each clinical research visit
- Study-related care by experienced Parkinson's disease research staff
- Study medication at no cost
- Transportation if needed
- Possible compensation for time

You do not need health insurance to participate. This clinical research study accepts all people with behavioral symptoms of Parkinson's disease who meet the entry criteria.

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
